SENIOR SCHOOL EXAMINATIONS

SEMESTER TWO

Tuesday 13 June, is the commencement of Semester Two. This will mean a number of changes in classes for some students. The Year 7 & 8s will have a change of language and/or technology and art subjects, for Year 9 and 10 students, they will have a changeover of all electives, as per their selections from last year. For the VCE students, most will continue with current subjects, however, Unit 2 and Unit 4 topics will be covered throughout the Second Semester.

All Year 9 & 10 students will have a significant change of subjects and teachers. To enable students to be involved in the classes that they selected, a number of changes will be required from one semester to the next. Year 10 is almost the last opportunity to "try" classes, before they make their selections for classes in VCE/VCAL. It is as equally important to decide which classes you do not wish to continue with, as it is to find the classes that you wish to pursue through to the end on VCE/VCAL.

Friday 23 June is the last day of Term 2. ***The school day will finish at 3:15pm for the Senior School, buses will run at normal scheduled times.***

Over the term break, maintenance staff has requested that lockers be cleared of rubbish and food scraps etc. A general clean up and maintenance of lockers will occur. **Students are to clean their locker over the last week of term.** Parents should also check school bags at the beginning of the term break to remove food items and uniform in readiness for the start of Term 3.

DEVELOPING READING SKILLS NEWS

Helping Your Child to Build Their Reading Stamina

Having stamina for something means being able to stick with something for periods of time. This stamina, or endurance, builds strength. Stamina can apply to a lot of different areas, such as exercise or painting. It can also apply to reading.

Teachers often think about a student's reading stamina. Reading stamina is a child's ability to focus and read independently for long-ish periods of time without being distracted or without distracting others. Reading stamina is something that parents can help students develop.

Spending longer periods of time reading means fewer interruptions and more time reading texts you find interesting and engaging. As your child moves into higher grades, having reading stamina will help your child navigate longer texts and assignments and assist them to develop productive study habits. Using the following tips you can help to develop your child's reading stamina:

1. Provide a variety of reading opportunities for your child: independent reading, read aloud and listen to reading. A combination of these three strategies should make up your child's reading time at home, especially for new or struggling readers.

2. Choose "just right" books. Your child should be able to decode almost every word in the book correctly when reading independently. If your child is reading aloud with you, or listening to reading, choose books that your child will find engaging.
3. Set reasonable time goals. When starting out, limit reading time to just a few minutes and increase the time from there. As your child becomes a more proficient reader, add more time each week.
4. Celebrate the time that is spent reading. Share your favourite characters, storylines and messages in books read, plan the next visit to the library, and share progress with other family members.

STAUGHTON VALE NEWS

STAUGHTON VALE – Term 2

The first experience for Term 2 took the Year 8 students to the gold rush town of Steiglitz. Here they had the opportunity to learn about the how the gold rush effected the area nearby Staughton Vale and what happens when there is no more gold. Furthermore, the students participated in Indigenous games, discovering how the Indigenous children filled in their time many years ago.

Visible from Staughton Vale are the impressive peaks of the You Yangs. This was the perfect site for the Year 6 students to undertake a walk to the top of Flinders' Peak and enjoy the magnificent view across the western volcanic plains. A flora and fauna study of the area enabled students to identify certain plant species and a number of animals that call the You Yangs home.

Whilst the Year 6 and Year 8 students were taking on different challenges and experiences in the surrounding areas, the property was being developed to enable students to spend the entire day on site, with classrooms, toilets and an administration building being installed. Sustainability has been at the forefront of our minds with the campus. Whilst town water has been connected to supply drinking water, a sewerage system has been installed, treating the water so it is safe to be used as irrigation. Combined with solar electricity and a back-up generator, the Staughton Vale campus is exemplary in its approach to sustainability.

With Autumn in full swing by the time the students were able to spend the day on the farm, they were greeted by orchards alive with colour, giving the photographers a chance to show us their skill whilst completing water testing and team building activities. Water testing involved the students sampling three different dams and determining whether they were healthy or not using chemical composition and biodiversity as indicators. Team building activities were also a feature on the first day, whilst these activities tested the students' ability to lead, listen and communicate effectively. This was also an opportunity to explore the farm more and gain a magnificent view of the surrounding area from on top of the Staughton Vale Campus Hill. Cooper and Noah from Year 6 have written about their Term 2 Staughton Vale experience so far:

Cooper (Year 6) wrote:

We are having lots of fun at Staughton Vale, with all the activities and testing we are doing. My favourite thing was the team challenges where we had to work together as a group to achieve goals such as flip a tarp over without anyone getting off

it. We are all looking forward to recreating the vegetable garden and the garden at the bus turnaround.

Noah (Year 6) wrote:

Staughton Vale was phenomenal. My favourite thing was sorting the water creatures and testing water samples. All of the students who went to Staughton Vale commented on how good it was. One of the best activities was working in a group to put a piece of wire onto the surface without our fingers leaving the wire. We can't wait to go there again.

This positive feedback is indicative of the general feeling towards the program from students and staff alike.

During the remainder of Term 2 the Year 6 and 8 students will visit Staughton Vale one more time. This final visit for Term 2 will involve medieval history where the students will design their own castle using the Staughton Vale property as the setting. The bus turnaround will get a green make over as the students will leave their first mark at Staughton vale by planting trees.
