LOCKS and LOCKERS

At the beginning of this year, each student is provided with a combination lock and a locker to store their books and other items whilst they are at school. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that they maintain a neat, tidy and locked locker. Storing belongings on top of the lockers may result in items being lost/removed.

MOBILE PHONES

Students and families are reminded of the use of mobile phones during the school day. Whilst the school realises that it is important for students to be able to make contact with parents/relatives regarding travel arrangements, mobile phones are to be turned off and placed securely in their locked locker upon arrival at school.

Should your child wish to make contact with you they must seek permission from the Year Level Coordinator or a staff member to use one of the School's telephones at the Administration Office. If parents wish to make contact with their child, contact must also be made and coordinated through the Administration office.

Students found with or using their mobile phone during school hours will be issued with an afterschool detention.

AFTER SCHOOL CLASSES and SENIOR SCHOOL LIBRARY

Afterschool classes for a range of subjects commenced again last week on Tuesdays (English and Science) and Thursday (Mathematics). This is a great opportunity for students who are requiring extra assistance offered by teachers to attend. Ideally, this is a time to ask questions and seek help rather than just complete homework.

The **School library** is open until 4.20pm each evening for students to come and study, research material or complete homework. Any student who attends the library after school must be for study purposes only.

LATE BUS

The late bus runs Monday through to Thursday afternoons departing at 4.30pm. Students requiring the late bus must sign up at the front office prior to the end of lunch to book a seat. The late bus incurs a charge of \$15.00 per trip which is charged to your School account each term. The late bus is a limited service and does not stop at all prescribed school bus stops.

POSITIVE PARENTI NEWS

Positive Parenting: Encouragement

People do better when they feel better! People feel better when they are encouraged and supported! This is particularly true for our children and more often than not a misbehaving child is a discouraged child. So how do we try and shape a change in behaviour for a discouraged child? Provide encouragement to your children for the efforts they have made not just reward/punishment for the end result.

Say, "I really liked the way that you worked hard every night on that project" or, "It was great to see you try and sound out the difficult words while you were reading today". Punishment and reward may lead to temporary positive results as a child strives to avoid punishment or gain reward but the price they pay is a loss of confidence, and loss of control.

For the next week, challenge yourself to say at least one encouraging thing every day, notice the way you feel saying it and the way your children respond to you at this time. It does not take much to change your focus to finding positives and can have fantastic results for your children's self-esteem and self-worth and your state of mind! Remember, if your child feels better, they do better! As do you!
