From the Principal

COVID-19 (Novel Coronavirus) – Emailed to Parents/Guardians 5 March 2020

I am writing to you in relation to the COVID-19 (Novel Coronavirus) pandemic and its impact on the School's voluntary trips program.

The School runs an ever-expanding range of voluntary trips, both overseas and within Australia. These trips give students the ability to experience a range of different environments and experiences in a safe and organised way.

When the School looks at such activities, its key criteria is the ability to minimise risk and maintain the safety of students and staff travelling on the trip.

School Staff have been meeting frequently to assess the risk that the pandemic presents for the school. We have considered the spread of COVID-19 which appears to be gathering pace, the current levels of morbidity and the high likelihood of both Australian and foreign governments introducing heightened infection control procedures.

At a meeting yesterday, it was decided that the risk had reached a point where it would be imprudent to either send or receive visiting overseas or interstate groups. I am writing to inform you that as such all voluntary trips will be cancelled for the foreseeable future. This includes upcoming trips to France, Singapore, Vietnam, Kokoda, PNG and Central Australia. We will also not be receiving students or visitors from overseas to the School for extended stays such as our French, Japanese or Indian visitors.

I am sure that this decision will be disappointing for many students and their families. The decision was not made lightly and, I reiterate, that it comes from our basic concern at all times to protect students and staff from unnecessary risk.

In looking at the level of risk of such trips it is also important to understand that our overseas partners are facing the same dilemmas as we are and it is highly likely that many of them will formally cease to accept visitors in the near future.

We want to re-commence the voluntary trips programme as soon as possible. As I am sure you understand putting specific dates or timeframes on that, at present, is not possible. The situation will be monitored frequently, and it is our hope that some experiences may be able to recommence later in the year or next year.

Over the next few days, the school will be going through the process of cancelling or rescheduling of trips. It is our intention to return any monies paid for trips. I would ask that parents are patient in this regard as this process does require significant administrative work.

I apologise for the disappointment this decision will create. Ultimately, I am responsible for the safety of children and staff on trips and I feel, at present, this is the only prudent decision.



Conveyance Allowance

Following a recent decision by the Student Transport Unit of the Education Department, it appears that there may be some movement on the way the Department makes a judgement on what is the nearest appropriate school. This comes after considerable work by the School on your behalf.

If your decision to send your children to Bacchus Marsh Grammar was because you felt that it was the nearest appropriate school that respected ecumenical values but did not require your child to participate in religious instruction or religious celebrations, then you may (subject to other Conveyance Allowance rules) be eligible for the Conveyance Allowance.

If this statement applies to you, whilst I can make no guarantees, I believe it is in your interests to submit a Conveyance Allowance Application for 2020. The application should be accompanied by a simple letter stating the reasons why you believe Bacchus Marsh Grammar is the nearest appropriate school because of its values and its lack of a requirement to participate in religious instruction or religious celebrations of any particular faith.

Please ensure that you complete the form that applies to your child's travel. Forms are available from the main office at both the Woodlea and Maddingley campus. Please be aware that no allowance is payable if the journey, to and from school, can be made using a free bus service.


