From the Principal

I hope that students and parents have settled in well to the new year. It has been wonderful to see the generally good spirit of students in the first week and their eagerness to engage with the new school year.

There are two things, however, that I do need to comment on; the small but increasing number of requests for alterations to the school day and a similar rise in belief the uniform will be altered by parental fiat.

I have a strong belief that the school day in the context of Australian schools are simply not long enough. If children are leaving and finishing class early to leave for whatever reason it has two impacts; it disrupts their learning but equally significantly it disrupts the flow of the class and the learning of others. The school day is well known to students and parents and has not changed in the last twelve months. We will therefore <u>not</u> be making alterations to the school day unless it is for absolutely essential circumstances. Things like after school work, tutoring arrangements, convenience, football training are not absolutely essential 'circumstances'. We expect students at BMG to be in class for the whole day virtually every day.

We have a small but increasing number of students and parents that believe that the uniform and appearance policy can be altered by personal choice. I wish to make it absolutely clear that this is not and will not be the case. When parents enter the school they do so by acknowledging the school's policies in relation to uniform and appearance and not only acknowledging them but agreeing to uphold them. The policies that are in place represent the clear view of the vast majority of parents about the kind of school they wish for their children.

If parents or students seek an exemption from the policy on any legitimate grounds there is a process contained within the policy to seek an appropriate exemption (particularly on religious grounds).

We will not accept students (with or without parental approval) simply altering arrangements to suit. I wish to make clear that the school will enforce its uniform and appearance policies and that students who will not follow the policies or who repeatedly flaunt them will find their positions at the school in jeopardy.

Achieving Optimal Academic Performance – Welcome to 2023



Welcome back to Bacchus Marsh Grammar in 2023. It is going to be a very exciting year with new facilities, new programs and new staff which will compliment and add to the already wonderful school community that we enjoy. By now, students have met their new teachers, found a home for their equipment in their lockers, "checked" out the food at the canteen and found the classrooms indicated on their new timetables. Throughout the year, I will be addressing ways (based on peer reviewed research and teaching experience), that our students, with the help of staff and parents, can optimise their academic performance and enhance their educational opportunities whilst at Bacchus Marsh Grammar. In the first addition of the

Podium for 2023, I would like to start with 5 simple habits that help to produce a successful student. These habits can be implemented from week one and will assist students to have a successful year.

1. Re-establish a routine around bedtime and sleeping patterns.

Sleep deprivation is one of the biggest detriments to students of any age doing well at school. Children of all ages from Prep to VCE need adequate sleep to improve their behaviours, mood and academic achievement Adequate amounts of sleep range from:

- School age (6-13 years) 9 to 12 hours
- School Age teens (14-18 years) 8-10 hours

And to ensure that your child's sleep in uninterrupted, keep technological devices out of the bedroom!

2. Manage your school diary.

Go through your school diary and/or school calendar and write down all key events. When are examinations? When are assessment tasks? When are the House Sports days? School holidays? Fill in your timetable and make sure that you fill in your diary every day. And most importantly, don't forget to have both your parents and Tutor Teacher sign it each week. This will ensure that you have someone helping you organise your school week.

3. Study as well as complete set homework.

This one may be obvious but study is different from homework. As well as completing homework, review your material consistently in small chunks and in different ways (for example, write flashcards one day, complete review questions and take practice tests the next). In other words, don't cram. Speak to your teachers to get further advice on what will work best for you and the individual subject.

4. Ask questions.

You are in school to learn and we are here to help, so don't be afraid to do just that! ASK FOR HELP! - from a teacher, a tutor, intern or your friends – you will obtain feedback and that is a sure-fire way to make sure you truly understand the material.

5. Get involved with the life of the school and have fun.

Your school community is awesome because more than likely there are other people sharing your passions. Go to an afterschool academic club, learn an instrument, join a band or book club, audition for the school musical or train with a sports team... It is fun to be involved, explore your interests and make new friends. Research shows that busy students are the highest achieving students!

Once again, I would like to take this opportunity to welcome everyone back to Bacchus Marsh Grammar and I look forward to another successful academic year.

PALS Program



Bus News

ID Cards

<u>ALL</u> Students have been issued their Student ID cards. They can use them to tap on/off the bus. Student ID cards are compulsory when boarding a private bus or attending all school excursions/camps etc and they must be carried at all times. Students who board the bus without their ID cards will receive a detention.

Student Permission Cards

Students in Prep – Year 6 require a green permission tag on their bag if they are to disembark the bus to be picked up by someone other than their parent/guardian. Students in Grade 5 & 6 can disembark the bus on their own if they have a green permission tag on their bag for the driver to check. Student Afternoon Bus Arrangement & Permission Notices are available on Schoolbox under School Letters. Please return Student Afternoon Bus Arrangement & Permission Notices to <u>bus@bmg.vic.edu.au</u>. **2022 Student Permission tags will be removed from the students' bags on Friday 17 February 2023.** Any student requiring an updated tag for 2023 must have an updated Student Afternoon Bus Arrangement & Permission Bus Arrangement & Permission Notice completed by this date so a 2023 replacement tag can be attached to their bag.

Late Buses

The late bus timetables can be access via the <u>school's website</u>. Students **must** attend Reception to sign up for the late bus before the end of lunchtime on the day which the service is required.

Maddingley Campus

This service is available from Monday to Thursday afternoons departing at 4.40pm, servicing Melton, Caroline Springs, Tarneit, Werribee and Manor Lakes. The late bus has been split into two routes for 2023. Late Bus 1 covers Melton, Caroline Springs and Tarneit. Late Bus 2 covers Manor Lakes, Werribee and Hoppers Crossing. This service is available for students in Year 4 to Year 12 who are involved in School Production or an after-school classes / activities. Services will commence from 6 February.

Woodlea Campus

This service is available only on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday afternoons departing at 4.40pm, servicing Caroline Springs, Williams Landing and Werribee. This service is available for students in Year 5 to Year 9 who are involved in School Production or an after-school classes / activities. The late bus for Woodlea campus will commence 20 February.

Parent Parking

It is recommended parents pull off the road into a service road or designated car park whilst dropping and picking up their child/ren. Parents need to be mindful not to park cars in the way of a bus and to ensure that the bus has enough space to safely drive into and pull out of the stopping area. Also, as there are bus stops in residential areas, it is important parents not park across residential driveways.


