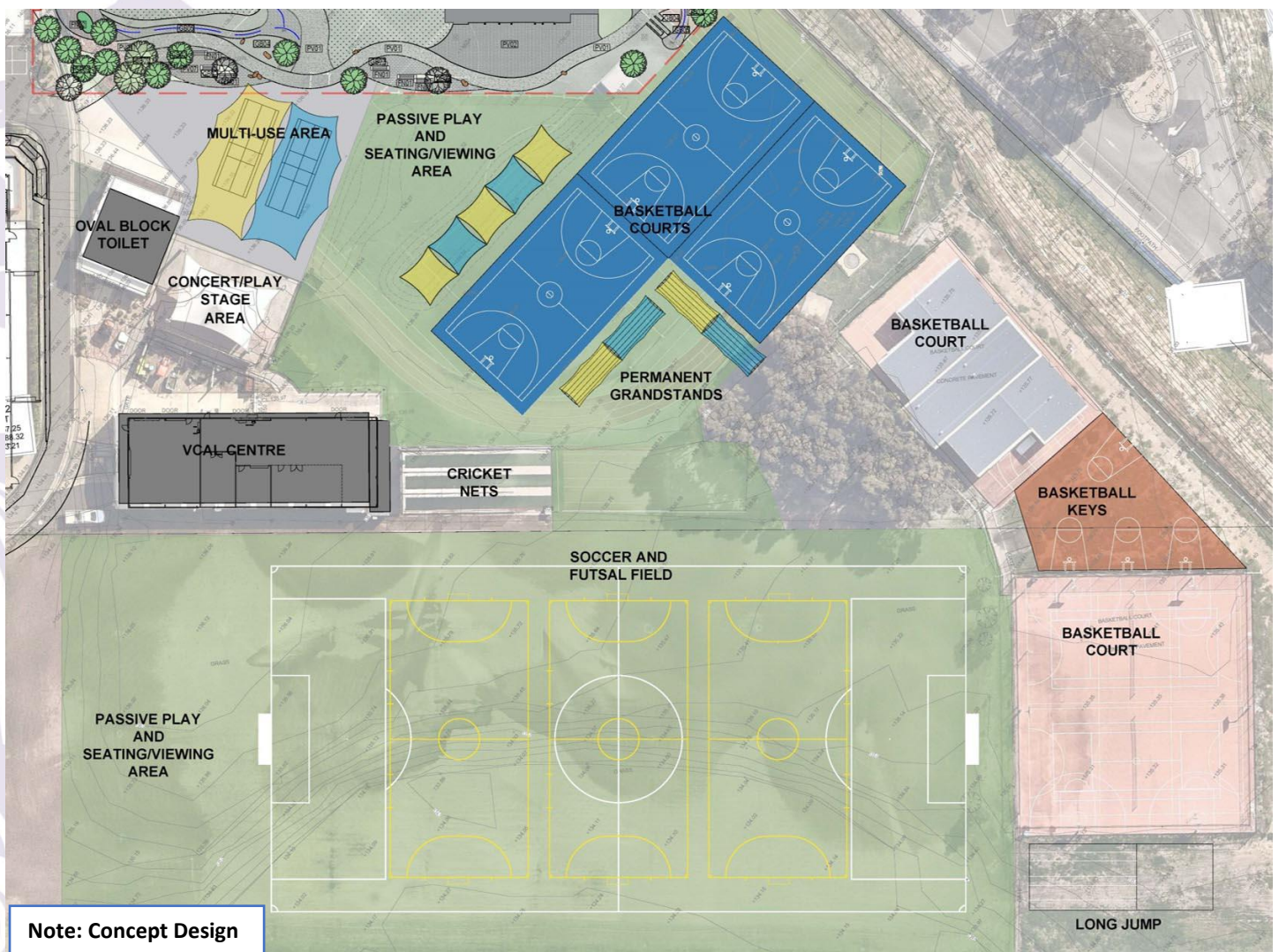
## From the Principal continued....

Over the break, significant site preparation continued at the Maddingley Campus, ready to receive the first delivery of modules for the Three-Storey Library/Classroom facility. You can view a fly-through video created by McIldowie Partners [here](#). The framework of the building has started to arrive and the new facility is quickly taking shape.



The area at the back of the Maddingley site, toward the bus turnaround has been expanded with more basketball courts in addition to the current soccer pitch and passive play space while the construction process continues.

This also paves the way for a “Southern Sport Precinct” which will commence in the coming months, connecting to the landscaping of the new Library building and offering a range of new basketball and badminton courts, passive play spaces, and a new viewing and a grandstand facility. This development is part of the new Library project and sees \$1 million dollars of investment in upgraded sports and active recreation facilities.



Academically, the school had an outstanding set of VCE results. I congratulate **John Cusmano** who was **DUX of 2022** with an ATAR of 98.65. I also congratulate **Jack Buskens**, who achieved a perfect score of 50 in Biology. Congratulations to all our 2022 Graduates.

## From the Senior Deputy Principal

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A warm welcome to our School Community, to all new students and staff.

### School Uniform

Students may wear their summer uniform for Term 1. Please ensure that hairstyles are within acceptable guidelines as set out in the school diary. Students need to be wearing appropriate school shoes; “ballet style,” “fashion” and “skate” (flat soled) shoes are not acceptable.

A reminder that for days forecast to be 30 degrees and higher, blazers do not need be worn to school. Students may also wish to wear their full school uniform (winter) on some of the forecast colder days. Do not mix sports uniform with summer uniform or with full school uniform, i.e. ties must be worn with long sleeved shirts, and runners are not to be worn with summer or full school uniform.

Please note that the anorak can be worn to protect the school blazer, not instead of the school blazer, and it is not to be worn to class.

Should your child be unable to attend in the correct uniform, there must be a note from a parent/guardian in the school diary.

Please review the School Uniform regulations set out in the diary in conjunction with the School Uniform and Dress Code Policy accessible via the [school's website](#).

### Phones/AirPods/Ear Buds/Headphones

All phones/ear buds/headphones etc must not be used on school grounds. This means that as students enter from the bus terminal or from the carpark, all of these devices need to be in their bag, and are not be used until students are leaving the school grounds. Students will not be permitted to use these while walking to their lockers or to/from the bus terminal/car park. If headphones are required in a class, this will be under direct instruction and monitored by a teacher.

Students seen with any of the above devices will have them confiscated immediately (especially at school entry points) and will be issued with an afterschool detention. Students can collect confiscated items at Reception at the end of the day. It is expected the students will follow staff instructions regarding this matter and any disrespect will be followed up.

Additionally, we expect that parents are not contacting students on their personal devices throughout the school day. If any urgent messages relating to transport or pick up arrangements need to be passed on, please contact Reception.

### Maddingley Car Park

A reminder to parents that there are dedicated zones designed for quick drop off or pick up and these areas are not to be used for extended parking. We also remind parents that there is no drop off or pick up on South Maddingley Road.

The parking conditions which are not onerous are designed for the safety of students and ease of access for all. We ask parents to be patient and mindful of their behaviours in the car park.

## Update to the Australian Fire Danger Rating System

A new Fire Danger Rating system was recently introduced across Australia which now consists of four levels of danger (Moderate, High, Extreme and Catastrophic). As a result of this new rating system, the Maddingley and Staughton Vale campuses are required to close on all days declared **CATASTROPHIC** for its fire weather district:

In addition to this, the School will also close the Staughton Vale campus on days declared **Total Fire Ban** and **Extreme** fire danger rating.

The decision to close will be confirmed by the School no later than 1:00pm the day prior to the closure and communicated to parents via email. Once a CATASTROPHIC fire day rating has been determined this decision will not change, regardless of any changes in the weather forecast.

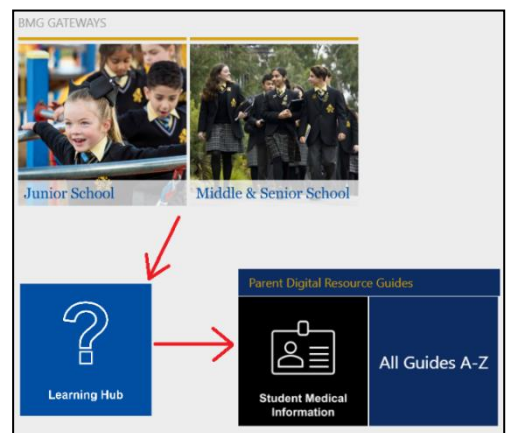

## Bus News



### Roll Call

On 20 January 2023 parents were sent a 'Welcome' email from Roll Call inviting them to activate the Roll Call app. Roll Call is for parents whose children travel on private buses, so they can track the bus in real time and receive notifications of when their child/ren tap on/off the bus. Roll Call is also for parents whose children do not travel on private buses but when they board a bus for a camp, excursion etc. It is advised ALL parents download the Roll Call app.

AM/PM changes: If parents require their child to change their AM or PM stop permanently, please contact the School Bus Services Administrator so this can be updated on Roll Call. For the safety of students and drivers, it is very

important that stops are up to date on Roll Call. If students are to disembark as a "one off" at a different stop on their designated route, parents are to update this in Roll Call prior to 1.30pm on the day of travel.

Note: If students are not travelling via a private bus in the morning, parents **DO NOT** need to advise the school. If your student is absent from school, parents are to call the absentee line at their child's campus and leave a message. If students in Prep – Year 6 are not travelling home via bus, a note in the child's diary is required in advance for the class teacher.

### ID Cards

Students have been issued their Student ID cards. They can use them to tap on/off the bus. Student ID cards are compulsory when boarding a private bus or attending all school excursions/camps etc and they must be carried at all times. Students who board the bus repeatedly without their ID cards will receive a detention.

### Student Permission Cards

Students in Prep – Year 6 require a green permission tag on their bag if they are to disembark the bus to be picked up by someone other than their parent/guardian. Students in Grade 5 & 6 can disembark the bus on their own if they have a green permission tag on their bag for the driver to check. Student Afternoon Bus Arrangement & Permission Notices are available on Schoolbox under School Letters. Please return Student Afternoon Bus Arrangement & Permission Notices to [bus@bmg.vic.edu.au](mailto:bus@bmg.vic.edu.au). **2022 Student Permission tags will be removed from the students' bags on Friday 17 February 2023. Any student requiring an updated tag for 2023 must have an updated Student Afternoon Bus Arrangement & Permission Notice completed by this date so a 2023 replacement tag can be attached to their bag.**

### Late Buses

The late bus timetables can be access via the [school's website](#). Students **must** attend Reception to sign up for the late bus before the end of lunchtime on the day which the service is required.

#### Maddingley Campus

This service is available from Monday to Thursday afternoons departing at 4.40pm, servicing Melton, Caroline Springs, Tarneit, Werribee and Manor Lakes. The late bus has been split into two routes for 2023. **Late Bus 1** covers Melton, Caroline Springs and Tarneit. **Late Bus 2** covers Manor Lakes, Werribee and Hoppers Crossing. This service is available for students in Year 4 to Year 12 who are involved in School Production or an after-school classes / activities. Services will commence from 6 February.

#### Woodlea Campus

This service is available only on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday afternoons departing at 4.40pm, servicing Caroline Springs, Williams Landing and Werribee. This service is available for students in Year 5 to Year 9 who are involved in School Production or an after-school classes / activities. The late bus for Woodlea campus will commence 20 February.



## Parent Parking

It is recommended parents pull off the road into a service road or designated car park whilst dropping and picking up their child/ren. Parents need to be mindful not to park cars in the way of a bus and to ensure that the bus has enough space to safely drive into and pull out of the stopping area. Also, as there are bus stops in residential areas, it is important parents not park across residential driveways.

## 2022/2023 Travel Conveyance Allowance Application Updates
