

The event brought together Farid Hamid, Aunty Eva Jo Edwards and Josh Robson to discuss 'The Australian Dream.' During their discussion, they explored how the values, opportunities and history of our country can inspire us to reach our full potential.



Farid Hamid is from Singapore and migrated to Australia as a child. His story, transitioning from a prosecutor to his true passion as a diversity facilitator, demonstrated to us how the school values of confidence and ambition can help us throughout our lives.

Aunty Eva-Jo Edwards is an Indigenous woman and a survivor of the Stolen Generation. Her story of rediscovery and guidance in her community show the impact of knowledge and wisdom that her ancestry holds, illustrating how piecing together a past can liberate a Dream.

Josh Robson is a cancer survivor and ironman athlete. Sharing the story of how he trained for a triathlon and battled cancer, showed us how discipline, along with the inspiration from family and friends, can motivate people through some of the toughest times of their lives,

The event showed us that "The Australian Dream" is a broad concept that can mean different things to different people, and how many people work with ambition and discipline to make their dreams a reality. Factors like life experiences, religion, gender, and social class can all contribute to a person's Australian Dream and how they achieve their dream.

The event planted a seed of wondering and hope for the future. What would our Australian Dream be?



For breakfast, the students could choose from numerous cereals and toppings to put on their toast. We ended the second day with a fantastic BBQ lunch and some freezing cold icy poles before departing for school.

Year 4 Sustainability Incursion

The Year 4 students at Maddingley campus were lucky enough to have an incursion with a guest speaker, Mrs Kristine Slater, a chemical engineer from Viva Energy. Our students spent their Science lesson time over the past week hearing from Kristine about her wealth of experience in the oil, paper and plastic recycling industries. They explored the concept of the life cycles of paper from seed to landfill or recycling plant, and of plastic from oil to landfill, as well as the greenhouse gas emissions and effect on the Earth's ozone layer from this carbon dioxide production. Students compared the energy requirements for paper and plastic production and learnt the benefits and downsides of each, including the lack of a readily available and effective soft plastic recycling program, and the debate between electric and combustion engine vehicles. They finished off the session with an ongoing experiment to observe the effect of biodegradation on a variety of cucumbers, including plastic-wrapped and unwrapped continental cucumbers to observe how plastic can extend the life of the cucumber whilst also reducing the food waste and greenhouse gas emissions caused by the need to produce additional cucumbers to meet consumer needs. The Year Four students thoroughly enjoyed these sessions from Kristine and we look forward to continuing on with our journey of learning in the plastic versus paper debate.

Year 2 Information Technology

This term's learning in Year 2 IT at Maddingley Campus will be the culmination of concepts learnt throughout Terms 2 and 3. We have been learning how to code through animations in the ScratchJr application in Term 2, then moved onto Code.org last term using lines of code and learning how to identify bugs in algorithms and debug those lines of code in order for the sequence of actions or events to occur as required. In Term 4, we are experimenting with coding Ozobot robots to follow algorithms to complete a program of code via sensors that detect lines. We are learning how to give the Ozobot instructions through a combination of coloured lines and black lines in sequence to guide our robots around a course, complete a task or knock over some miniature ten pin bowling pins. We are looking forward to the exciting coding challenges coming up for the rest of the year!
