Geography City Excursion



As part of the Human Geography Urban Management curriculum, students took part in an overnight excursion to the city where they investigated the impacts of current and future climatic change. Students visited several sites and locations across the city, observing sustainable green building design and management, in order to understand whether or not Melbourne can be classified as a sustainable and resilient city to tackle

climate change. Areas of focus included sea level rise, extreme heat waves, droughts and flood, and increased pressures of population growth.

Students were required to complete observational and social surveys, interviewing and observing the public in order to gain an

insight into people's beliefs, attitudes, practices and their understanding of Melbourne's climate adaptation projects. It was great to witness the transformation of each student as they stepped out of their comfort zones and interacted with the public in an unfamiliar setting.

Year 8 Indigenous Experience at Staughton Vale



Last week, Year 8 students visited our Staughton Vale campus to explore Australian Indigenous culture and learn more about the local Wadawurrung people.

The scene was set with a video compilation of Indigenous elders and educators talking about culture, medicinal and food plants. Students participated in activities focused on bush medicine, bush foods and Indigenous games. The day was full of exploring, tasting and trying new things.

The newly discovered "Medicinal Trail" guided students on a walk to see medicinal plants growing on the property, while back in the science room, they made an inhalation and poultice as part of the bush medicine activity. On the

oval, students learnt some traditional Indigenous games -Goori, Kai and Marn Grook. They had a lot of fun trying to play them and learnt the value of community. The bush foods activity challenged their senses. Students tasted a range of native bush herbs, spices and fruits used in sweet and savoury cookery, before a stroll to the Indigenous edible garden with a lemon myrtle syrup beverage in hand.

The sun was shining, laughs and excitement were audible throughout the day, and students left with a newfound appreciation and some knowledge about Australian Indigenous culture.

Any student boarding at BMG without a MYKI or credit on their MYKI card could be refused travel on a public bus and parents will be called to collect their child/ren from the school.
