Welcome to Term 4

Welcome back to Term 4! We trust that families had an enjoyable and relaxing break and students are ready to work hard during the final term of 2023.

We ask all parents to familiarise themselves again with the uniform requirements for Bacchus Marsh Grammar. This can be accessed via the school website as well as your child's diary.

With the change in uniform from full school uniform to summer uniform, typically we find that students have grown over the past six months and uniforms need altering or replacing. Please take the time to review your child's uniform and make any necessary changes. Tutor teachers/classroom teachers will place a note in your child's diary indicating the changes that need to be addressed. A reminder that the full school uniform can be worn all year round should your child feel it is too cold for the summer uniform.

Again, we ask that you take the time to familiarise yourselves with the school's expectations re hairstyles, with particular focus on hair not shaved less than a number 3 and to be evenly graded. It is important that the instructions provided to the barber/hairdresser are clear. Students who choose not to follow the school's expectations will be asked to address the issue as a matter of priority.

Students must also be clean shaven. Students who do not adhere to this requirement, without a valid exemption, will be asked to present themselves clean-shaven to the Deputy Principal the next school day.

Students are permitted minimal jewellery, again this is clearly outlined in our policy. We are currently seeing a large number of students wearing excessive jewellery to school and we ask that you monitor this also.

Students whose uniform does not meet Bacchus Mash Grammar's uniform requirements will have a note placed in their diary. Please keep an eye out for this and review your child's diary regularly.

We look forward to working with all our families throughout the remainder of the year. We aim for a calm and successful term with students working hard on their studies as well as engaging in extra-curricular activities.

On Friday 18 August 2023, the Year 9 cohort of Woodlea joined together to tune into a discussion with three panellists who shared their unique experiences with our classes. This active conversation involved our guests answering questions from the students and talking about how their stories and journeys helped define their identity today.

Eva Jo Edwards is a Mutti Mutti, Boonwurrung and Yorta Yorta woman and survivor of the Stolen Generations, her journey was about how much time she spent unearthing and reconnecting with the culture she lost as a child. Josh Robson is the owner of "Turn Up" and is one of the most inspirational survivors of cancer who stated that "His toughest days taught him how to live his best life." Josh's goal is to share his story about how by turning up, showing self-drive, having empathy and relentless optimism, you can weather the toughest of storms and become the best version of yourself, no matter what the circumstances. Farid Hamid was a Police Criminal Investigator and Deputy Public Prosecutor in Singapore before he discovered his passion in diversity, equity and inclusion while on an assignment in Guyana, South America. He has been creating and hosting DEI programs internationally over the past 18 years. He specialises in utilising experiential methodologies in facilitating unique, impactful DEI learning experiences.

Panellists Eva Jo Edwards, Josh Robson and Farid Hamid gave an empowering insight into their versions of the "Australian Dream" and "The Best of Us." From my experience, this session with the speakers truly opened a new perspective of the Australian Dream to all the students who were actively listening and posing questions in the Q&A

session for the panellists to answer. Fortunately, my question was answered by Aunty Eva Jo who really opened a large discussion which I found very inspiring and influential. As these discussions were happening, I thought about what was going through their minds during their times of hardship and really appreciated how they overcame them. This seminar taught the Year 9 cohort a lot about what the Australian Dream means to them and how it brings out the best in us.


Cameron's Road vis Elmas Estate UPDATED Timetable Term 4
