Principal Andrew Neal – Retirement Notice

The Board of Bacchus Marsh Grammar (BMG) wishes to announce to its community that our esteemed Principal of 26 years' service, Mr Andrew Neal, has advised the Board that he will be retiring from his role of BMG Principal at the end of the 2025 school year.

This announcement is being made at this time, in accordance with BMG's constitution, to advise our BMG community of the steps the Board is taking to ensure that an appropriate person and leader is identified and appointed to the Principal role in the future, and to advise that Andrew Neal will play a key part in ensuring the successful transition and support for the new BMG Principal during this period.

There will be opportunity in the future for the entire BMG community to appropriately acknowledge and celebrate Andrew's service and legacy to BMG. The Board wishes to convey its heartfelt thanks to Andrew for his enormous leadership and contribution to BMG over the past 26 years as BMG's Principal, to his service to education generally over the past 38 years, and to highlight some of Andrew's many achievements.

It is anticipated that the new Principal search will commence in early 2024 with the aim of selecting the Principal elect during 2024 and with an operational start in early 2025. The timeline may vary depending upon BMG and the successful candidate's requirements. BMG has appointed external expertise in the form of Diana Taylor from Diana Taylor Legal Consulting and Executive Recruitment Agent ANZUK, to lead and support BMG in the search for our next Principal.

The BMG Board will continue to keep the BMG community up to date at the relevant time with further announcements regarding the Principal recruitment process in 2024.

On behalf of the BMG Board, thank you for your support as BMG enters this next phase of its service and education for our community, and our sincere thanks and gratitude to our Principal, Andrew Neal.

Maddingley Co-Curricular Clubs

Middle and Senior School Co-Curricular Clubs for 2024



Do you want to learn a new skill? Do you want to try something new? Then the new and improved timetable for cocurricular program is for you!

In the coming weeks a number of new and established clubs and activities will be available to all students in the Middle and Senior Schools. Mostly taking place at lunchtimes, after school and (some) weekends, all students will be given the opportunity to experience a number of clubs and activities.

According to recent research, employers rated the students who were at least minimally involved as significantly more hireable than those who were not involved. Employers also rated highly-involved students as significantly more career-ready than uninvolved or minimally-involved students. Further findings and similar research imply that any type of co-curricular involvement at school is beneficial for students' career aspirations and that employers notice more participation.

When students participate in co-curricular activities, they build confidence, form relationships, increase collaboration, improve their problem-solving, gain new skills, improve resilience, nurture individual well-being and develop crucial skills for life after school. Students engaged in experiences outside of the classroom develop different skills from those who are only involved in the classroom, thereby bringing balance to the student experience and helping nurture the student holistically.

The bottom line is, the more involved a student is, the more they will be satisfied with their school experience.

Bus Update

Temporary Update for KOALA ROUTE

Stop 3 on the Koala Route, Cobblebank Stadium, Bridge Road is inaccessible due to road works on Ferris Road. This stop will not be available for students in the AM or PM for boarding or disembarking. Students are advised to use another stop on the koala route that is suitable or convenient. We are of the understanding this will be for all of February 2024.

Roll Call

On 29 January 2024, parents were sent a 'Welcome' email from Roll Call inviting them to activate the Roll Call app. Roll Call is for parents whose children travel on private buses, so they can track the bus in real time and receive notifications of when their child/ren tap on/off the bus. Roll Call is also for parents whose children do not travel on private buses but when they board a bus for a camp, excursion etc. It is advised ALL parents activate their Roll Call account.

AM/PM changes: If parents require their child to change their AM or PM stop permanently, please contact the School Bus Services Administrator so this can be updated on Roll Call. For the safety of students and drivers, it is very important

that stops are up to date on Roll Call. If students are to disembark as a "one off" at a different stop on their designated route, parents are to update this in Roll Call prior to 1.30pm on the day of travel.

Note: If students are not travelling via their private bus in the morning, parents DO NOT need to advise the school or update Roll Call If your student is absent from school, parents are to call the absentee line at their child's campus and leave a message. If students in Prep – Year 6 are not travelling home via bus, a note in the child's diary is required in advance for the class teacher.

ID Cards

Students will be issued their Student ID cards. Students MUST use their Student ID card to tap on/off the bus. Student ID cards are compulsory when boarding a private bus or attending all school excursions/camps etc and they must be carried at all times. Students who board the bus repeatedly without their ID cards will receive a detention or further consequences.

Student Permission Cards

Students in Prep – Year 6 require a green permission tag on their bag if they are to disembark the bus to be picked up by someone other than their parent/guardian. Students in Grade 5 & 6 can disembark the bus on their own if they have a green permission tag on their bag for the driver to check. Student Afternoon Bus Arrangement & Permission Notices are available on Schoolbox under School Letters. Please return Student Afternoon Bus Arrangement & Permission Notices to bus@bmg.vic.edu.au. All 2023 Student Permission tags will be removed from the students' bags on Friday 16 February 2024. Any student requiring an updated tag for 2024 must have an updated Student Afternoon Bus Arrangement & Permission Notice completed by this date so a 2024 replacement tag can be attached to their bag.

Late Buses

The late bus timetables can be accessed via the school's website. Students must attend Reception to sign up for the late bus before the end of lunchtime on the day which the service is required.

Maddingley Campus

This service is available Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday afternoons departing at 4.40pm and servicing Melton, Caroline Springs, Tarneit, Werribee and Manor Lakes. The late bus has been split into two routes for 2024. Late Bus 1 covers Melton, Caroline Springs and Tarneit. Late Bus 2 covers Manor Lakes, Werribee and Hoppers Crossing. This service is available for students in Year 5 to Year 12 who are involved in school productions or after-school classes / activities. Services will commence from 6 February 2024.

Woodlea Campus

This service is available only on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday afternoons departing at 4.40pm and servicing Caroline Springs, Williams Landing and Werribee. This service is available for students in Year 5 to Year 10 who are involved in school productions or after-school classes / activities. The late bus for Woodlea campus will commence 12th February 2024.






Health Centre Reminder

Please update your child's medical information via the parent portal as per instructions below. If your child has medical information you feel we need to know, please contact the Health Centre at your child's campus.


1. After logging into schoolbox, if you click the quick links option on the menu, you'll find the 'My Details' button

EdSmart – notifications for excursions/key school communication

All families are sent notifications and permission forms for completion via the EdSmart email notification system. Look for 'Bacchus Marsh Grammar' in your inbox. Always check your 'junk mail' just in case a notification is missing.

Multimedia Consent via EdSmart

Annually the School seeks parental consent for use of multimedia containing BMG students.

Multimedia is defined as photography, video, audio or any other form of electronic recording. It can be used in school publications such as the Yearbook, <u>Grammarian</u>, weekly <u>BMG eNews</u>, on the school website, Schoolbox and can extend to advertising and social media.

Photography and videography can occur across all campuses or off-site at school events, activities, camps and excursions. Multimedia will be collected, used and stored in accordance with the School's Privacy Policy.

Parents will be sent an EdSmart notification next week to complete the Multimedia Consent process for 2024. We request that parents review the categories listed within the email and complete the consent process by **Friday 9**

February. If not completed by this date, students will be marked as DO NOT CONSENT for all categories in 2024 and excluded from all photography/videography. This consent will be active for a full school year. If you have more than one child attending the school, you will be sent an EdSmart notification for each child.




