It is with mixed emotions that I announce that Executive Deputy Principal Kevin Richardson will be retiring from that position at the end of 2024. Remembering the van den Hende family and sunflowers



17 July 2024 marks the 10th Anniversary of the MH17 disaster and the loss of the van den Hende family.

Shaliza and Hans had organised a trip for their young family Piers (15), Marnix (12) and Margaux (8) to visit the Netherlands and Malaysia. Their flight from Amsterdam to Kuala Lumpur was shot down in an area of the Ukraine controlled by Russian backed separatists. On that day, the school lost five members of its community to an act of senseless violence. Piers, Marnix and Margaux were much loved contributors to both the school and the wider community. Their loss had a significant impact on the school at the time. The conflict that brought MH17 down was a pre-cursor to the current war in the Ukraine with an estimated loss to date of over 500,000 people.

The van den Hende and Dewa families contributed a significant amount to the establishment of a perpetual scholarship fund which continues to this day, to commemorate the family.

The field that MH17 came down in grew sunflowers. Some of the seeds of those sunflowers were collected and three seeds (in perspex) were donated to the school. Other seeds linked to those in the site were also given to the school after having gone through biosecurity. These seeds have continued to be propagated at the school's Staughton Vale campus. The pictures of the sunflowers are of the progeny of those initial seeds.

These plants and posters will help to remind us of the tragic loss of the van den Hende family.

While the sunflowers have a clear link to the tragic death of the family, they also have a broader meaning of positivity and hope; characteristics that were part of all members of the van den Hende family. They also represent character traits that are valued by this community.

Please enjoy the pictures as they are displayed across the school and understand their deep significance to our community, and take heed of the message of positivity and hope.

Administration News

Communication – EdSmart notification to students

Parents/Guardians are familiar with the school communication platform EdSmart which is used to relay school information and seek digital consent for class excursions, camps, sporting events via a notification slip.

This platform also allows for the school to 'cc' communication slips to students, so they receive via email the necessary information for upcoming activities and due dates. The difference between the format for parents/guardians and students, is that the consent section is not accessible to students. They do, however, receive a notification when parents have consented to an activity.

The school will be activating this feature in EdSmart, for students to receive the communication slips for all excursions, camps and events for Years 5 to 12 where consent is required. This will enable students to have clear detail of the event/activity date, materials they are required to bring, uniform expectations and transport.

This may also assist in student's ability to prompt parent/guardian consent if deadlines are not met.

EdSmart Consent

Please note that EdSmart will be the only acceptable form of providing consent for your child to attend school activities/sport/camps or similar. Notes in diaries and emails to Heads of Sub-Schools, Heads of Year and/or Teachers will not be accepted moving forward. 

- If you have to move away from home, where are you going to live?
- What support services are there on campus (e.g., careers services, counselling)
- What scholarships do you offer?

Student ID Cards



The Woodlea Book Fair will be held from Monday 2 September – Friday 13 September. Watch this space!


