
Year 11 Literature Excursion to the NGV: Exploring First Nations Art and Culture

The Year 11 Literature students from Bacchus Marsh Grammar embarked on an enlightening excursion to the National Gallery of Victoria (NGV). The focus of this visit was to engage with the First Nations Art and Culture program, a unique initiative designed to immerse students in the rich artistic traditions and contemporary expressions of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.



The program began with an introduction to Wurrdha Marra, the NGV's dedicated display of First Nations art and design. Students were captivated by the diversity and depth of the artworks, ranging from traditional dot paintings and bark art to modern multimedia installations.

Students then participated in a guided tour led by knowledgeable NGV educators, who shared invaluable insights into the themes and techniques evident in the artworks. These discussions highlighted the resilience, innovation and storytelling embedded in First Nations art, thereby fostering a deeper understanding and appreciation among the students.



In addition to exploring the visual art, the program included a focus on the role of art in communicating the voices and experiences of First Nations people.

This complemented the Year 11 Literature curriculum, particularly the current unit on Voices of Country, in which students examine how literature and art serve as mediums for expressing identity, culture and history.

The Year 11 Literature classes are grateful for the opportunity to explore these important concepts and look forward to more engaging learning experiences in the future.
